IMPROVEMENTS TO THE FLINDERS HWY

I applaud the federal and state government for being on the same page to improve key roads in the Flinders Shire, which are vital to delivering a more reliable freight and tourist route in our region.

Work has started on a \$25 million upgrade of seven ageing culverts on the Flinders Highway between Charters Towers and Richmond, thanks to Australian and Queensland Government funding.

For far too long investment has focused on upgrading the Bruce Highway, but now federal and state funding is starting to flow where it is needed to ensure the economic sustainability of rural and regional Queensland.

However, there is still a long way to go to bring our inland network up to standard.

Sections of the Flinders Highway, are among those listed in a network of around 16,000 kilometres in the Inland Queensland, Roads Action Plan (IQ-RAP) that are not up to scratch.

The IQ-RAP is not just about providing a more reliable and safe road network to our regional towns, it is also about providing a funded forward program to provide certainty for local governments to retain critical skills sets and maintain a stable workforce.

This is vital to the 33 local governments in the IQ-RAP region, with regional unemployment rates at an all-time low, particularly youth unemployment.

We look forward to further bi-partisan commitments to regional roads to support regional economic development.

Mary Gilmore (nee Cameron) won August 16, 1865 near Goulbu South Wales, the eldest child of Scottish-Irish stock.

She went to school in mid NSW becoming a teacher at Wagga W eventually moving to Sydney.

In 1890 she met Henry Lawson a became involved in a relationshi However any hope they might ev wed was soured by Lawson's fre absences from Sydney.

In 1893 she became involved with Australian Workers' Union and stathe shearers and maritime strikes She helped William Lane's New A movement which was intent in se socialist utopian colony in Paraguended in miserable failure).

She moved to Paraguay in 1896 w married Victorian shearer, William ander Gilmore and their only child William, was born there two years As the colony fractured in disagree the Gilmore moved to Patagonia w she taught English before they can to Australia in 1902. Her literary wo published by the Bulletin and her knection with the "Australian Worker in 1908 after asking for a woman's p She was invited to edit it herself wh did until 1931.

She and William split up and he mov Cloncurry to work on the land.

She devoted her later years to writing volumes of verse while encouraging writers and she was awarded Dame of British Empire.

William Gilmore passed away in 1945 from blood poisoning and was buried at Cloncurry.

Mary remained a Sydney celebrity end of her long life. She died in 1962 97 and after a state funeral in Sydne ashes were buried in her husbands. The headstone is in Section 4, Plot 1448 – Derek Barry
