Business case requirements checklist

This template will assist proponents in providing information to enable a project proposal to be assessed.

The checklist is meant as guidance only and is not a prescriptive tool.

Business case review process

The RDA committee is approached to support a local project. RDA committee provides the Business case requirements checklist to potential applicants. Applicants submit project proposals to the RDA committee. RDA committee assesses proposals using the *Business case review* template. RDA committee rates proposals to assist in identifying which proposals to support. Business case requirements checklist	Provided to applicants seeking the RDA committee's support to inform them of the information the RDA requires to assess the project. Used by the committee to guide assessment.	Project proponent
Business case review template	Used by the RDA committee to assess and score projects for feasibility and alignment with Regional Plan, and determine next steps.	RDA committee
Business case feedback template	Used by the RDA committee to provide feedback after it has completed the review process. This can be used to identify improvements the project plan may require.	Project proponent
