Townsville & NW QLD region comprises the 15 local government areas of Boulia (S), Burdekin (S), Burke (S), Carpentaria (S), Charters Towers (R), Cloncurry (S), Doomadgee (S), Flinders (S), Hinchinbrook (S), McKinlay (S), Mornington (S), Mount Isa (C), Palm Island (S), Richmond (S) and Townsville (C). ### Estimated resident population

As at 30 June 2017, the estimated resident population (ERP) for Townsville & NW QLD region was 266,903 persons. The annual growth rate between 2016 and 2017p was 0.3 per cent.
